In 2016 the Oakura School's 150th Jubilee (1866-2016) was held, celebrating 150 years of education in Oakura. Oakura School started in 1866, operating out of a private residence, until in 1880 the first school buildings were built on the current site. In those early years there were two nearby schools, Koru and Kirihau. Koru School was established in 1880 and Kirihau School in 1924. Both schools existed to support families of the local timber mill workers and local farmers. As these mills closed, Kirihau School amalgamated with Koru School in 1934, with seven students transferring. Then in 1939 the twenty students at Koru School joined with Oakura School.

Today Oakura School is a vibrant well-resourced school situated 12 km from New Plymouth city in the popular beach location of Oakura. It is a full-primary (5-13yr olds) with approximately 380 pupils spread across fifteen classrooms. The majority of the children live in Oakura Village with a few children travelling from rural areas by bus.

School programmes are closely related to the environment and local places of significance. The peak of the Maunga, Mt Taranaki, is visible from our school grounds, with our school situated at the base of the Kaitake Ranges. Our local marae is the Okorotua Marae at Oakura Pa and our hapū is Ngāti Tairi. Our river is the Oakura-Matapu River and the Matekai Stream borders our school property. We have four school houses: Patuha, Koru, Wairau and Matekai – all named after places of significance in our community. Our pupils proudly take part in many environmental projects within our community. For example: beach clean-up day, spinifex planting on the beach, planting in native bush areas, stream monitoring, planting and nurturing native plants in our plant propagation unit and Enviro Centre and taking part in inquiries supported by local environmental groups.

Our students have an active lifestyle. Many students are fully involved in skiing and water sports, such as surf life saving, body boarding and surfing. Most of the children are members of the Oakura Junior Sports Club. This club offers a wide range of sports including cricket, soccer, netball, hockey, basketball, mini-ball and tennis. Oakura School plays a significant role in providing a social meeting place and community facilities such as the School/Community Library, the Oakura Junior Sports Club and the tennis courts.

OAKURA SCHOOL

Oakura School is community-based and maintains a close liaison with its surrounding area. It shares the use of the library and tennis court facilities with the community. The school utilises the surrounding environment of the beach, local pa sites, farmland, mountain and other places of interest.

Oakura School is a full primary (Yr 1 - Yr 8), catering for students within a family environment.

The school provides for the needs of students in many ways:

CREATING A QUALITY LEARNING ENVIRONMENT

As parents/caregivers you can make a significant contribution towards the stability, growth and development of the school. Children's education is a team effort and communication is vital in ensuring that this effort is productive.

How you can help:

- Feel welcome at our school, free to share your ideas and to give praise where deserved. If offering constructive suggestions please direct them to the right people
- Be supportive of the vision, values and policies of the school, and take part in opportunities that the school offers
- Where possible, offer your help or expertise, or be a parent helper

GENERAL SCHOOL INFORMATION

APP

The school app 'Oakura School' is a great way to find out more about what is happening at our school. Download it onto your phone and ensure the notifications are on so that you can see the messages we send out to our families.

ATTENDANCE

All students are required by law to attend school regularly. All students should arrive at school by 8.50am each morning ready to start school by 9.00am. We ask that you please communicate with the school by 9.00am to inform us if your child is going to be absent or late. If you do not ring or send a message via the app, we will contact you to check that your child is safe. We do this as a safety precaution for your child. If your child arrives at school after 9am they must report to the school office and sign in on the 'sign-in device'.

BEHAVIOURAL EXPECTATIONS

Oakura School has high expectations for behavior. Our students are encouraged to behave in a caring and responsible way at all times. The school behavior plan and school rules are reviewed with all students on a regular basis.

BOARD OF TRUSTEES MEETINGS

This is a community elected governing body of our school. Board meetings are held in weeks three and eight of each term, with the dates being advertised on the school's community calendar. These meetings are open to all parents who wish to attend. Please feel free to contact the principal or any of the Board members to discuss any matters of concern.

BRING YOUR OWN DEVICE (BYOD)

We encourage years 3-8 students to bring their own IT device to school each day, as a tool to support their learning. BYOD and cyber-safety agreements must be read and signed by the students and their parents prior to bringing the device to school. Secure cabinets are provided for students to store their devices when they are not using them.

CELL PHONES

We do not allow students to use their cellphones during school time. Students requiring a cellphone due to after school commitments and parent contact, must deliver their phone to the school office prior to the start of the school day and collect it after the 3pm bell. No responsibility can be taken for cellphones not handed in.

COMPLAINTS/CONCERNS

We encourage parents to come and see us as soon as possible if they have any concerns regarding their child's progress at school. The first person they should approach is their child's teacher. If the issue can not be resolved in that situation, the parent/caregiver should make an appointment to see the principal.

CYCLISTS

You are advised to check the safety of the route your child takes to meet a bus or to school. All students must wear a correctly fitted safety helmet.

DENTAL CLINIC

Our students are treated at the Rangiatea Dental Clinic. Please contact the clinic directly with any queries - ph 7513507.

DUTY

To ensure out of class supervision for students while they are at school, staff members are on duty during play/interval times. Duty teachers wear a fluoro jacket so they are clearly visible. Any changes in bus travelling arrangements or requests to leave school grounds need to be referred to the teacher on duty.

EMERGENCY EVACUATION

In the case of school buildings needing to be evacuated, all people on site will assemble on the school rugby field. All students and adults must stay in this area until they are informed by the school management team that it is safe to leave.

ENROLLING NEW ENTRANTS

Starting school for the first time is a milestone and an exciting event for your child. Getting off to a good start is most important and involves a partnership between home and school. It is quite natural for new entrants to experience worries about starting school, as well as excitement. Be positive and reassuring when your child shows concerns. You will be contacted four to six weeks before your child turns five to arrange some time for your child to visit their class to assist a smooth transition. Your child's birth certificate and immunisation certificate is required to be sighted on enrolment.

EXTENSION ACTIVITIES

On most occasions extension activities are provided from within the normal classroom programme. However senior students, in particular, are encouraged to participate in competitions outside the school, such as mathematics, science and technology challenges, Literacy Quiz, inter-school debating, speech and sports competitions. In year 7 & 8 students have the opportunity to work towards excellence awards in areas of: sport, academic, cultural and citizenship.

FRIENDS OF OAKURA SCHOOL

Friends of Oakura School (FOOS) is a committee of parents who meet a few times a year along with the Principal and a teacher representative. FOOS supports the school by fundraising for the extras that we would not have otherwise, usually by organising fun events and activities. New ideas for fundraising or activities are always welcome, and you don't have to be on the committee to make suggestions – just drop a note in the FOOS box ma the school office or ring a committee member. New committee members are always welcome.

HOMEWORK

All students in the school have homework most nights. It may include reading, maths tables, spelling, completion tasks and/or research tasks. We feel homework provides a link between home and school and fosters some excellent habits. We encourage you to provide your child with a quiet place and time each night (approx 30 minutes in senior classes).

INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY

Oakura School prides itself in the quality of information technology programmes and resources we have available for all students. Students have access to computers across all learning areas to support their learning.

КАРА НАКА

All students take part in a weekly half hour kapa haka session where they learn waiata (songs), tikanga (customs) and te reo (the language), Students also have the opportunity to join the school kapa haka roopu.

LEADERSHIP (YR7&8 STUDENTS)

We are very proud of the leadership opportunities offered to all year 7 & 8 students. Leadership skills are developed through weekly leadership skill sessions and the allocation of leadership roles for all year 8 students.

LET'S GO

Our school is part of the NPDC Let's Go programme. It encourages our students to be active on the way to school by either walking, biking, travelling by bus or scootering. Your support with this programme is appreciated. We are part of the programme because:

- Exercise before school prepares readiness for learning and it's good for you
- Walking and riding to school is social
- Active travel on the way to school helps promote independence and self-confidence
- It's good for the environment and your pocket
- It improves congestion and safety around the school gate

LOST PROPERTY

All clothing, bags, stationery etc that is used at school should be named. It is then very easy to return property that is found. The lost property is placed in a trolley situated in the foyer between rooms 3 and 4. The junior classes have clothes baskets in each room.

LUNCHES & MORNING TEAS

Children are supervised by a staff member when they are eating their morning tea (10:40-10:50am) and lunch (12.40 - 12.50). We ask that children bring a healthy morning tea and lunch from home. Drink bottles filled with water can be used during class time. Carbonated drinks, sweets and chewing gum are not permitted at school.

MOUTH GUARDS

Years 5-8 students playing tackle rugby at school are required to wear a mouth guard. These can be purchased from the school office.

MUSIC

In line with a desire to provide wide opportunities for our students, the school employs a music teacher who works with our older students during class time. There is also itinerant music teachers who provide lessons for students who choose to take up this option. For more details contact the school office.

NEWSLETTERS

These are emailed to all families every Thursday and are also available on the school website and school app.

OUTDOOR EDUCATION

We see this in a wide educational context. To us it includes activities in various parts of the school grounds, village and town, sporting events, social experiences and excursions to distant places. We do ask for a range of support in giving our students education in local and wider environments.

PARENT/CAREGIVER HELPERS

Your assistance is highly valued and encouraged by the staff. We regularly arrange for parent helpers in the classroom, in the library, to help with craft, sports, activities, on trips or camp supervision. If you have special skills, special interests or just a desire to help, let us know.

PARKING

Please do not park in the bus bay outside the school between 8am and 4pm. Buses use this area regularly throughout the day and require easy access to the footpath area to ensure students safety getting on and off the bus. The yellow lines on the road outside the school entrance should be kept clear at all times.

RESOURCE TEACHER OF LEARNING AND BEHAVIOUR

Our school's RTLB visits once a week. The RTLB works with students, teachers and parents to provide support where specific behavioural or learning needs are identified.

REPORTING TO PARENTS AND CAREGIVERS

Oakura School provides formal opportunities for parents/caregiver-teacher contact.

Term 1: Meet the teacher and parent meetings

Term 2: Learning conferences and learning conferences

Term 4: Written report

Interviews may be arranged at any time throughout the year, simply by emailing or telephoning the teacher concerned. We see the education of your child as a partnership between home and school and value the opportunity to consult about this.

ROAD PATROL

The School Road Patrol, supervised by a teacher, operates daily in the afternoon between 3:00 and 3:15pm at the Donnelly Street – Main Road corner and just below the school on Donnelly Street. All students are expected to use the crossings in accordance with the warden's instructions. We appreciate adults also using the crossing and being positive role models for our students.

The main road crossing is supervised in the mornings (8:30-8:55) by parent volunteers. If you are willing to help with this, please contact the school office.

SCHOOL BUSES

Our school is serviced by two school bus runs operated by Tranzit Bus Lines and Withers coachlines. Please contact Tranzit or Withers Coachlines if you need further information.

SCHOOL COMMUNITY LIBRARY

This is situated beside the school and is used jointly by the students and the public.

It is open: Mon, Wed, Fri 11am to 5pm

Tue, Thurs, Sat 9am - 1pm

Membership of the Oakura School Community Library is free and books are available from the New Plymouth Public Library on request. Librarian – Vincenza Clark ph. 7596060.

SCHOOL DONATIONS AND ACTIVITY FEE

The Activity fee is \$30 for rooms G,P,1,2,3, 4, 5, Kauri, 6,7,8, Tawa and \$50 for the intermediate classrooms. This covers the cost of buses and activities throughout the year to save collecting small amounts as these events happen. We would appreciate this being paid early in the year as we have to pay for these services as our students use them.

The school donation assists us in meeting the growing demands of resources needed for the school. Because we are a decile 10 school we get considerably less funding from the government than other schools. Therefore we really appreciate the tremendous support we get from our families in paying the school donation.

The school donation is \$150 for each student per year. School donations do not include GST and because they are classified as a donation they can be claimed in full on your tax return.

SCHOOL HOURS

Our school is officially open for children from 8:30am-3:15pm. During this time teachers are on duty to supervise your children. If your child is coming to school earlier than 8:30am or staying later than 3:15pm teachers are not on duty at this time therefore children play at school at their own risk. Outside of these hours teachers are busy in their classrooms preparing work and are not supervising playgrounds. The exception to this will be bus children who are at school until 3:50pm and are supervised by the teacher on bus duty.

SCHOOL OFFICE HOURS

The school Office Manager, Mrs Amanda Cavey, is in attendance from Monday-Friday 8:00am to 3:30pm.

SCHOOL UNIFORM

The school's colours are red and black. Sunhats are available to purchase from the school office. The school's sports uniform is a red shirt and black shorts. You are encouraged to purchase these, so that your child can feel proud when involved in school fixtures.

SICKNESS

If your child is unwell at school, you will be contacted and asked to come and collect him/her. If you are not able to be contacted your emergency will be rung. When a student has a head injury, parents/caregivers are notified immediately. Please ensure the office has accurate, current details of names and phone numbers of all parents/caregivers and emergency contacts.

SMOKEFREE POLICY

Oakura School is a totally smokefree environment. All school events, on and off the site, will be smokefree at all times.

SPORTS

We are fortunate to have the Oakura Junior Sports Club who organise all out of school hours sport. For more information contact Susan Eagar or check out the OJSC facebook page or their webpage (www.ojsc.co.nz). Interschool sports events occur regularly throughout the year and there will be times when we seek your help with transport and supervision of teams.

SPORTS COURTS

Our school is very fortunate to have high quality netball and tennis courts available for our students. The cost of this astroturf was raised by the Oakura Tennis Club. We ask that students respect this surface and not walk on it wearing studded sports shoes. These courts are owned by Oakura School and are used as a shared facility with the Oakura Tennis Club. Our students have preferential use of this area during school hours. The Oakura Tennis Club has preferential use of the courts outside of school hours. If you are using the courts please do not adjust the tennis nets.

STATIONERY

Stationery lists for each student are given out at the end of the school year so stationery can be purchased during the school holidays. Stationery lists are also on the school app and the school website. Stock to replace books finished throughout the year is available at the school office. A stationery pack for new entrant children is also available at the school office.

SUN PROTECTION

We are an accredited 'Sunsafe School' therefore students are required to wear a school uniform hat when outside in terms one and four and when needed in terms two and three. The school provides sun shades to minimise the harmful effects of the sun's rays during the summer.

SWIMMING

Swimming lessons are a part of our basic curriculum and all students need to bring their gear on their class swimming days. A note is needed to excuse non-swimming because of illness. Students must wear bathing caps when in the school pool.

TECHNICRAFT

All Years 7/8 students attend technicraft at Devon Intermediate. All students get instruction in a range of technology areas. Students are expected to wear shoes for safety.

TERM DATES

Check the school app for current term dates.

TRANSPORT

It is school policy that when students travel by private car, the vehicle must have one seatbelt per child (a three point seatbelt, not a lap belt), have a current warrant of fitness and registration and the driver must have a current driver's license. Children under 9 years cannot sit in the front seat if there is an airbag. All children are required to be correctly secured in an approved restraint until their seventh birthday (including booster seats).

TOYS/PERSONAL ITEMS

We encourage toys and personal items to be left at home. If children want to bring a toy to show the class, this item should be handed in to their class teacher for safe keeping.

USE OF SCHOOL FACILITIES

The community is encouraged to use the school grounds. Organisations wishing to do so should first obtain Board approval. We ask those who use the grounds and playground equipment informally to respect our property. Dogs, bicycles, skateboards and motorcycles are not permitted in the school grounds.

WORKING BEES

These are not called for very often. When we do call for them it is for an important reason and your support is gratefully received.
